

Dr. Ezekiel R. and Edna Wattis Dumke Foundation Charitable Fund 2023 Fall Giving Report

In Partnership with the Community Foundation of Utah

The first annual grantmaking cycle of the Dr. Ezekiel R. and Edna Wattis Dumke Foundation Charitable Fund was administered in 2023 by the Ogden Circle of Giving (OCOG) in partnership with the Community Foundation of Utah. Weber County focused 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations which promote positive change through creativity, innovation, education, or enhanced well-being were eligible for funding.

After careful consideration, the OCOG selected Seager Memorial Clinic and YCC Family Crisis Center for the Fall 2023 grant cycle. These organizations are committed to making a positive impact in serving the underserved communities of Northern Utah. Seager Memorial Clinic

- Grant Awarded: \$29,013.00
- Mission: The Seager Memorial Clinic's mission is to provide free, easy-access, non-judgmental, charitable medical, dental, vision, and mental health care to the underserved.
- Request: Funding for the "Legacy of Healing" capital project aimed at transforming Ogden's former Family History Library into a leading free medical and dental clinic.

YCC Family Crisis Center

- Grant Awarded: \$29,013.00
- Mission: YCC supports individuals and families impacted by domestic and sexual violence through safety, advocacy, and resources on their journey to safe and healthy lives.
- Request: Funding to support immediate YCC operational needs so they can continue providing critical services for victims of violence, including additional operational costs needed to support the new 14-unit transitional housing facility to open in the summer of 2024.
